Missions Prayer Request February 2020

The "Prayer Patterns" devotion for February 3, 2016*, has a good lesson for us as we pray for ourselves, for our missionaries, and for others. It recalled Jesus' miracle recorded in John 2:1-11. Mary, the mother of Jesus, saw the problem, and she alone knew Who could fix it. She brought the problem to Jesus when she said, "They have no more wine." These simple words stated the problem but were extraordinary because of what was *not* said. She did not instruct Jesus in how to solve the dilemma or lecture Him on exactly what He was to do.

It is good to pray specific prayers, but sometimes we are so specific we miss His answer. God may hear and respond, but in a different way than we asked, desired, or expected. Perhaps it is good for us just to bring our burden to Jesus, lay it before Him, and then wait in expectation without telling him exactly what to do or when and how to do it.

Jesus, we praise You that Your ways are higher and mightier than ours. We are grateful to serve a God Who sees and knows all, a God Who created us and knows what is better for us than we know ourselves. I pray today for those serving you on the missions field and also have a problem; something broken; or a financial, physical or relational need. I ask you to cultivate courage in their hearts to simply place that burden before You and then to step back and wait in expectation for You to work. We praise You for Your faithfulness!
